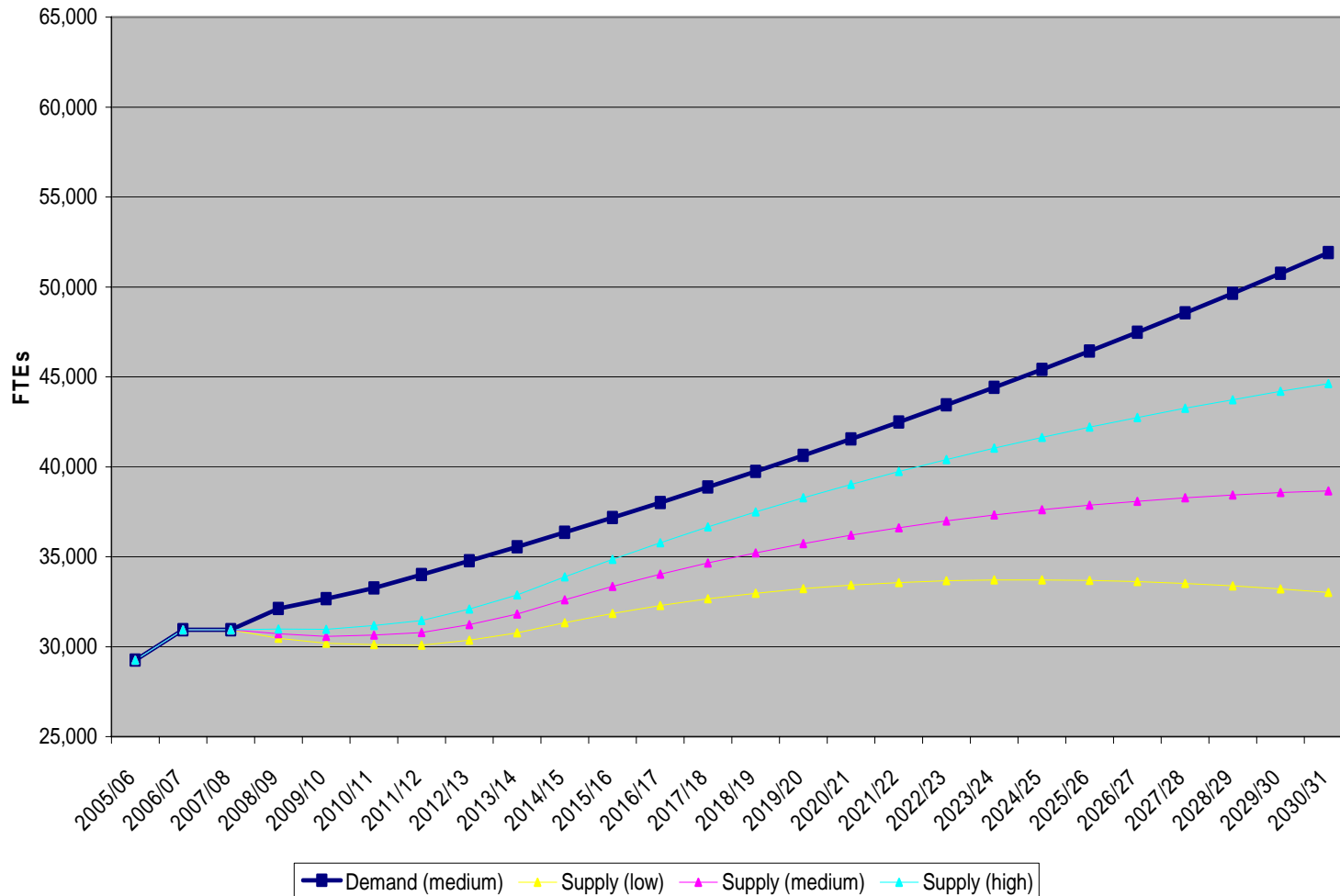

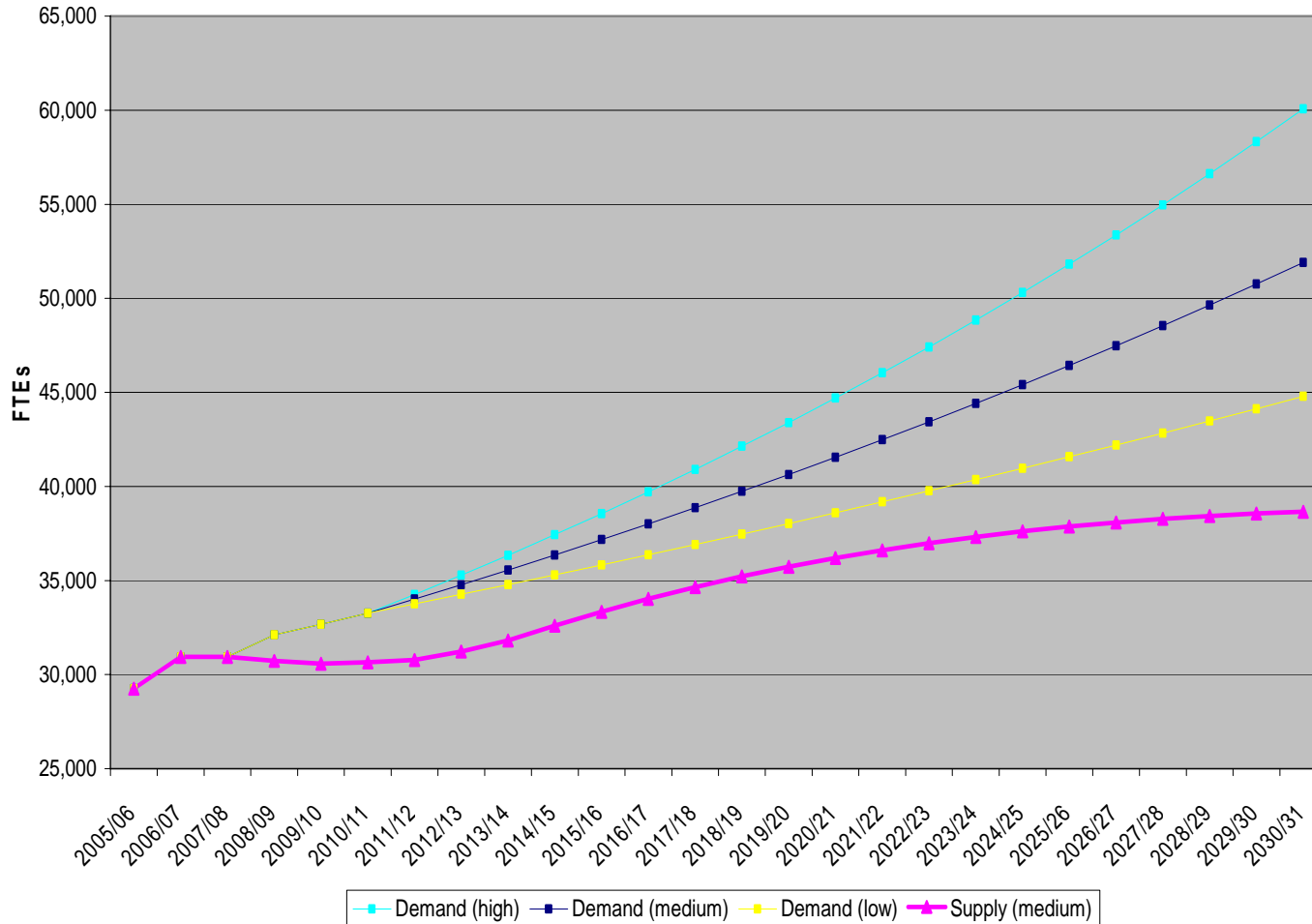
There is a clear risk of an undersupply of GPs (1 of 2) – *with impact of supply side variation*

There is a clear risk of an undersupply of GPs (2 of 2) – *with impact of demand side variation*

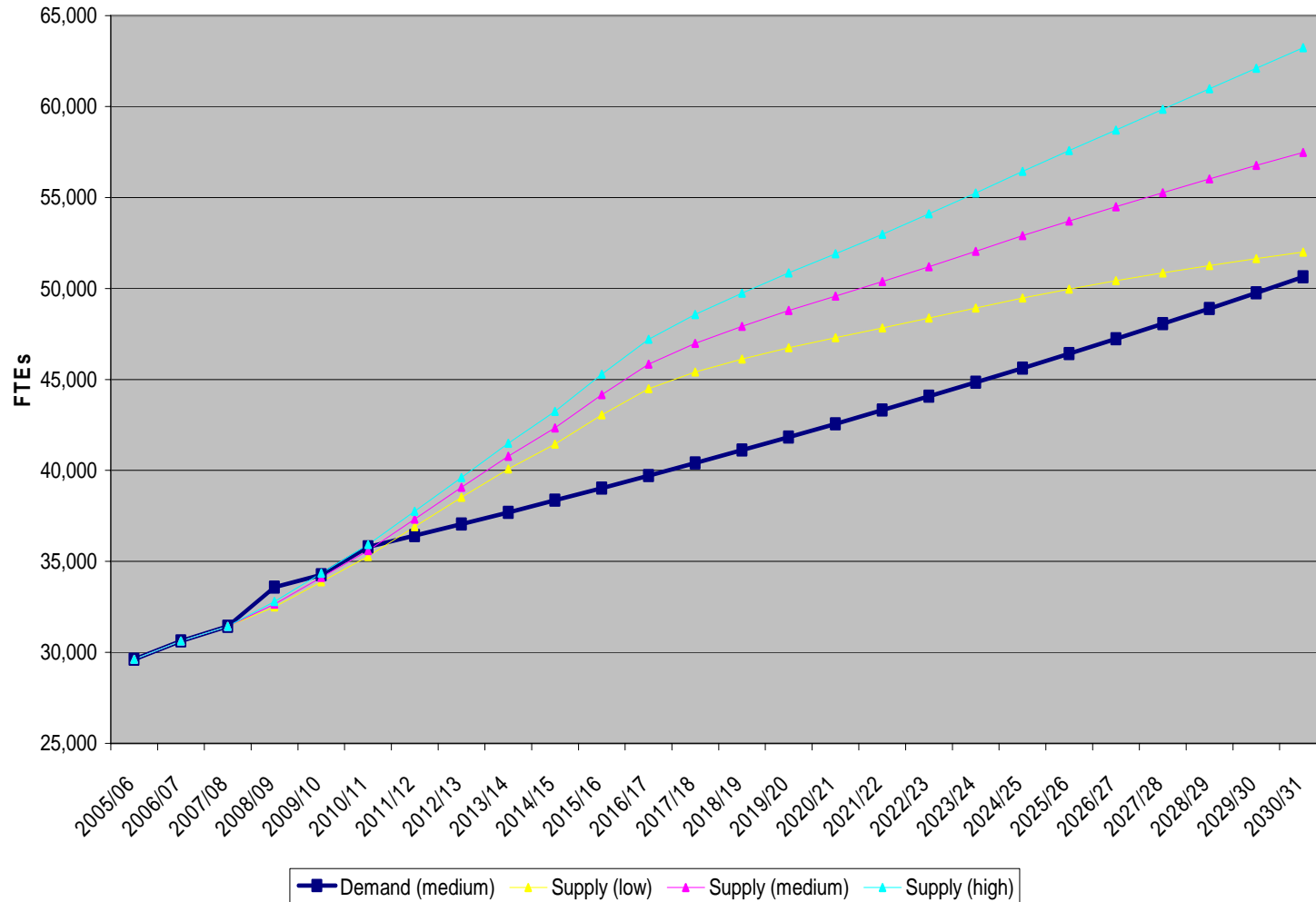
Comparison of forecast GP demand and supply

(1 of 2) – with *impact of supply side variation*

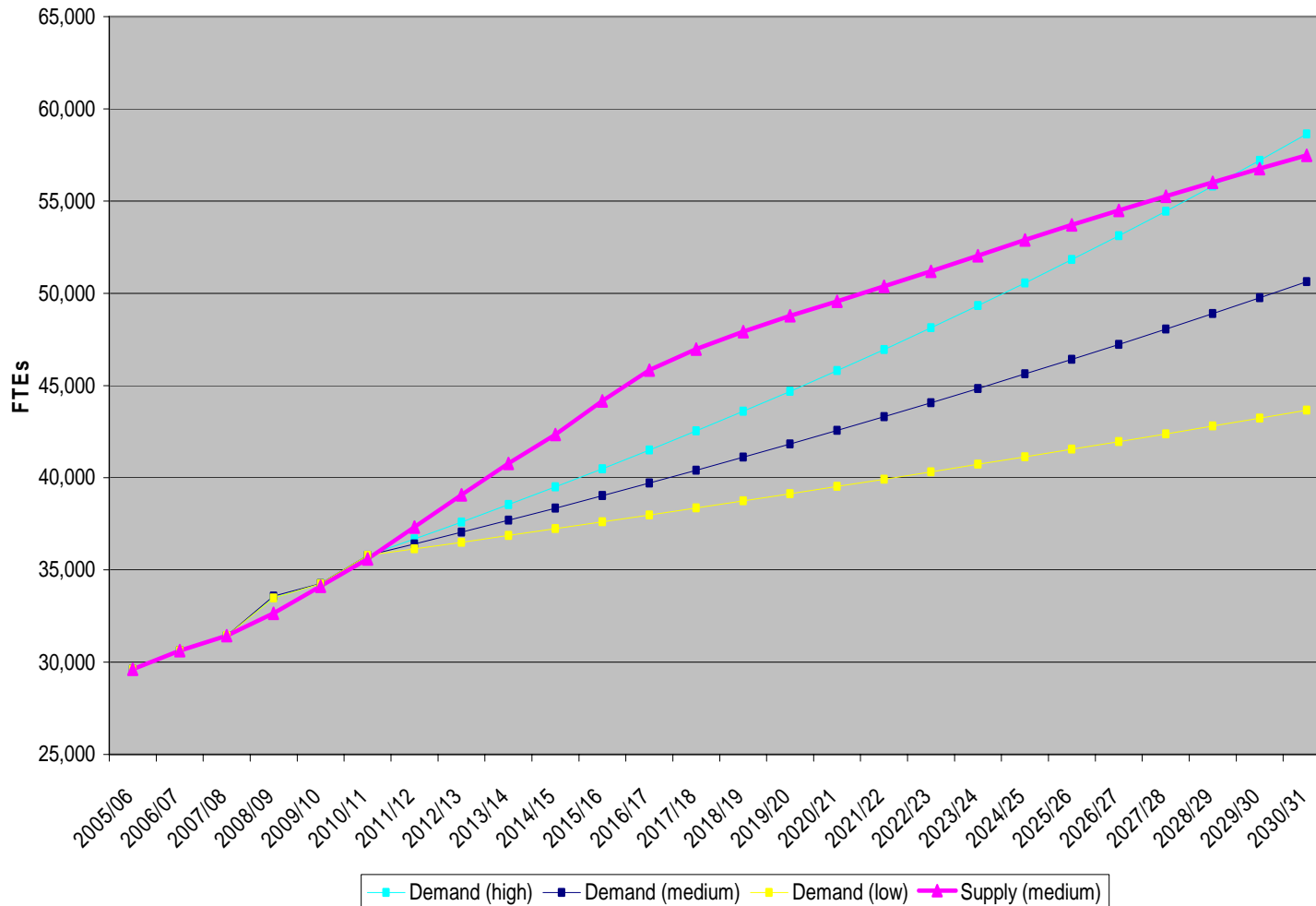
Comparison of forecast CCT holder demand and supply

There is a clear risk of an oversupply of CCT holders

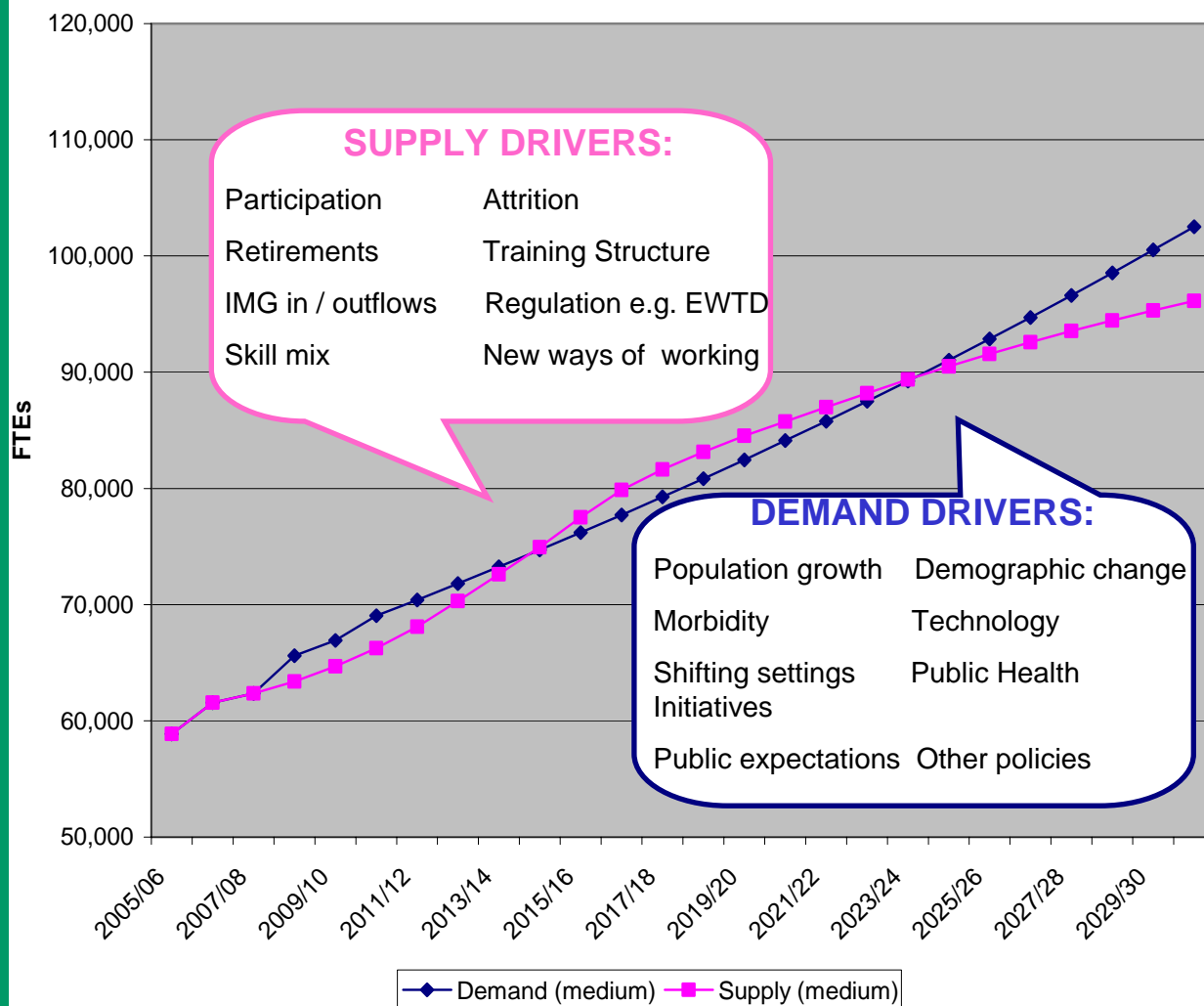
(2 of 2) – with *impact of demand side variation*

(medium supply and various demand scenarios)



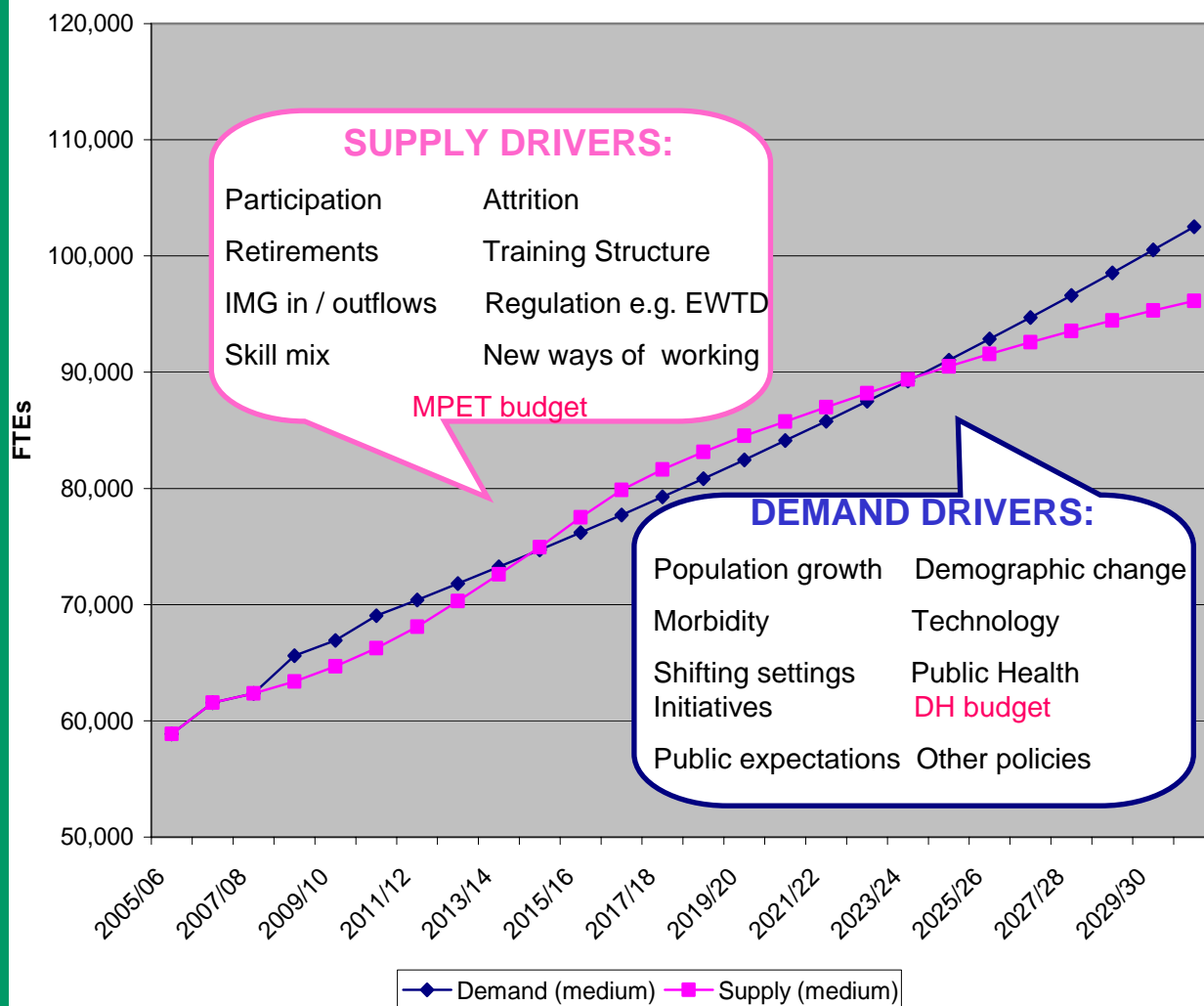
Overall, analysis suggests a broad balance in supply and demand for trained doctors in the long term

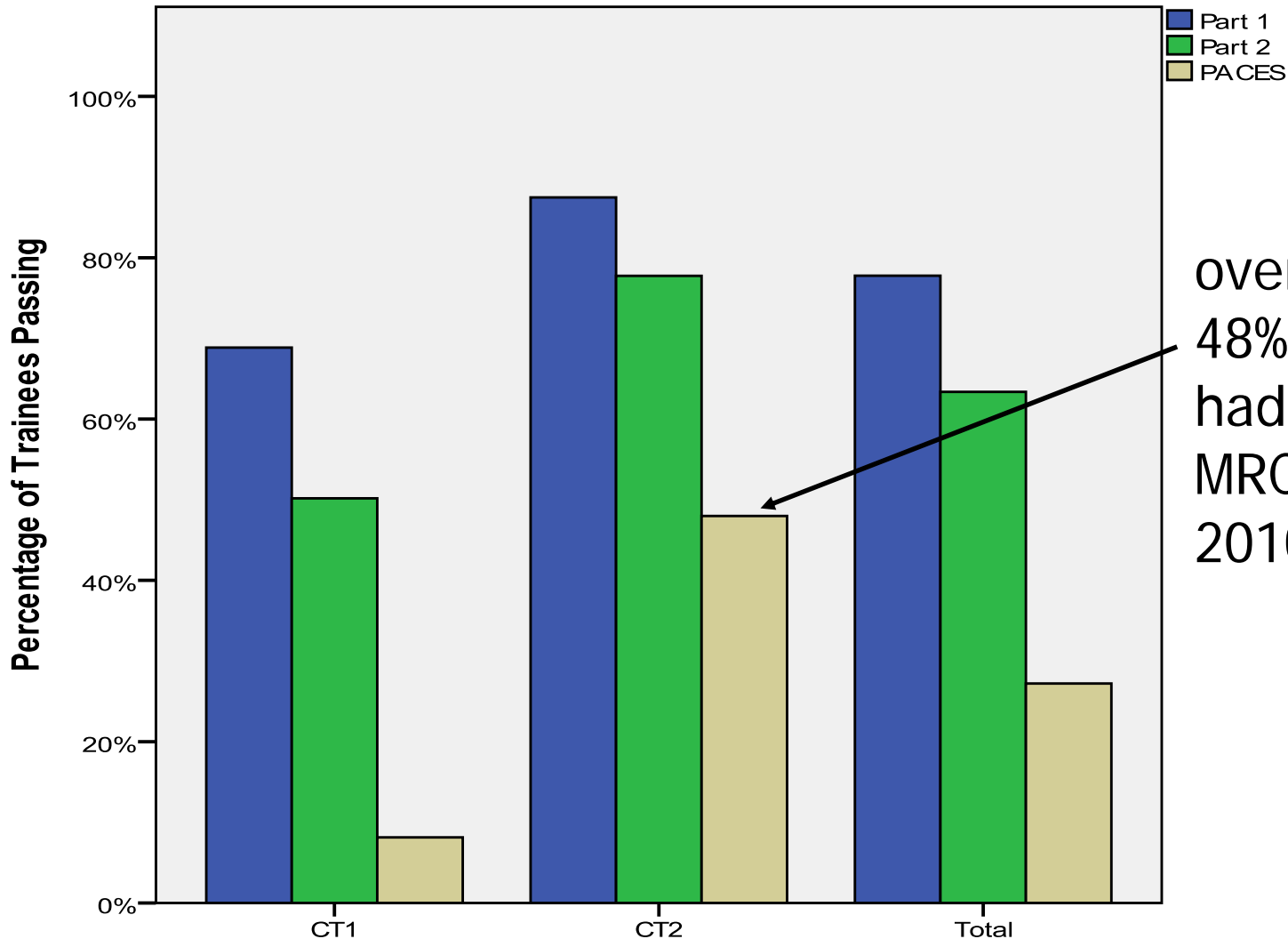
Key Issues

- Role of college tutor in training
 - *assistance with curricula & ePortfolio*
 - *CMT, possibly GIM for ST3+*
 - *possible role in QC/QM of core training?*
- Curriculum review - Project 2010
- Role of college tutor in MRCP(UK)
 - *how can the college tutor contribute?*
 - *teaching & delivering PACES*

MRCP(UK)

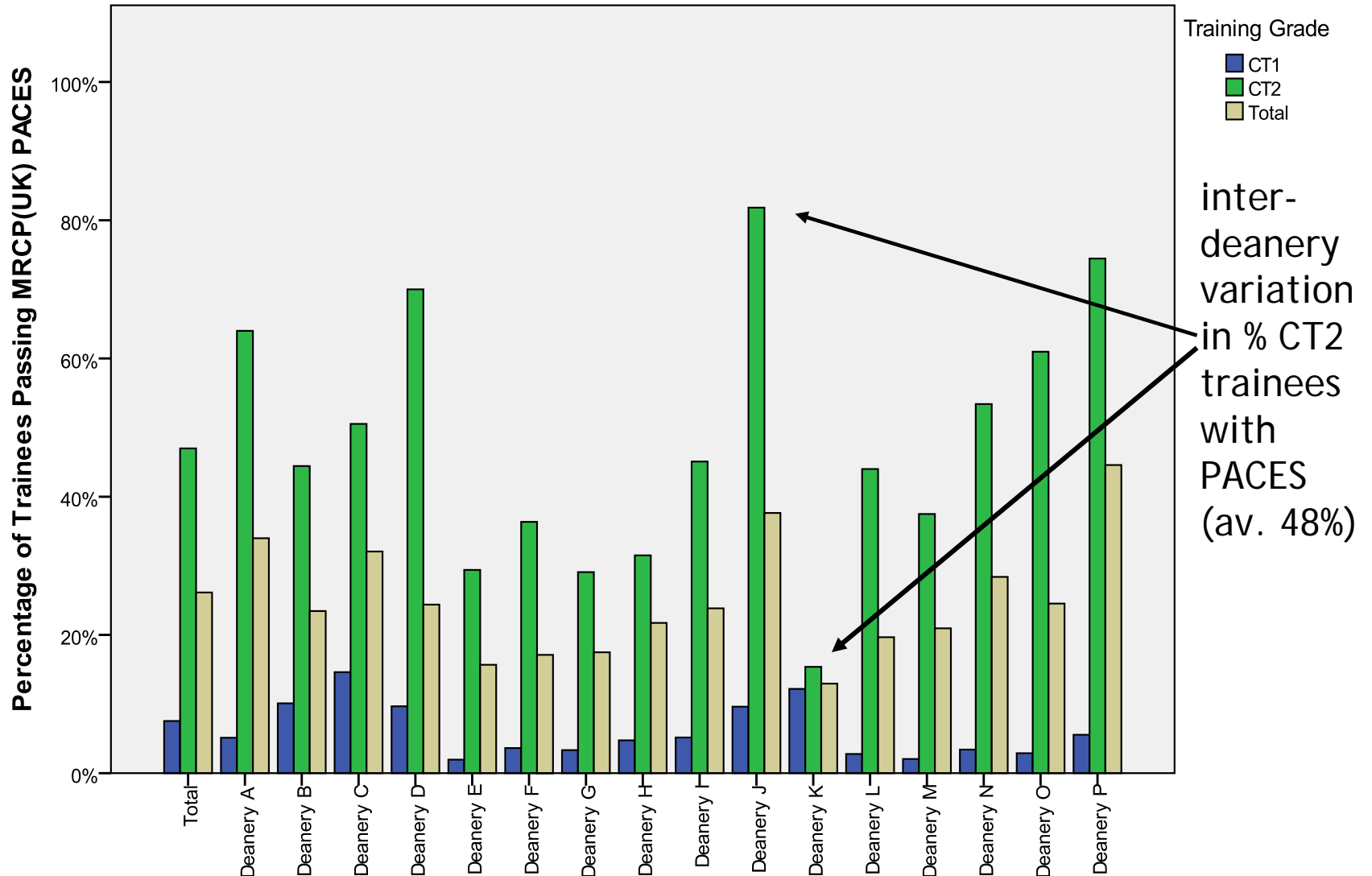
- Mandatory for entry ST3 posts Aug 2011
 - *communications to 2009 CMT cohort*
- Effectively need to pass exam (ie PACES) by 1st diet 2011 for ST3 application period
- Large inter-deanery variation in exam acquisition
 - *partially reflects Foundation School approach*
- Success of 2009 cohort wrt MRCP is crucial to Deaneries and service
- Monitor progress of 2008 v 2009 cohort CMT trainees

% with PACES (by 2010.1)

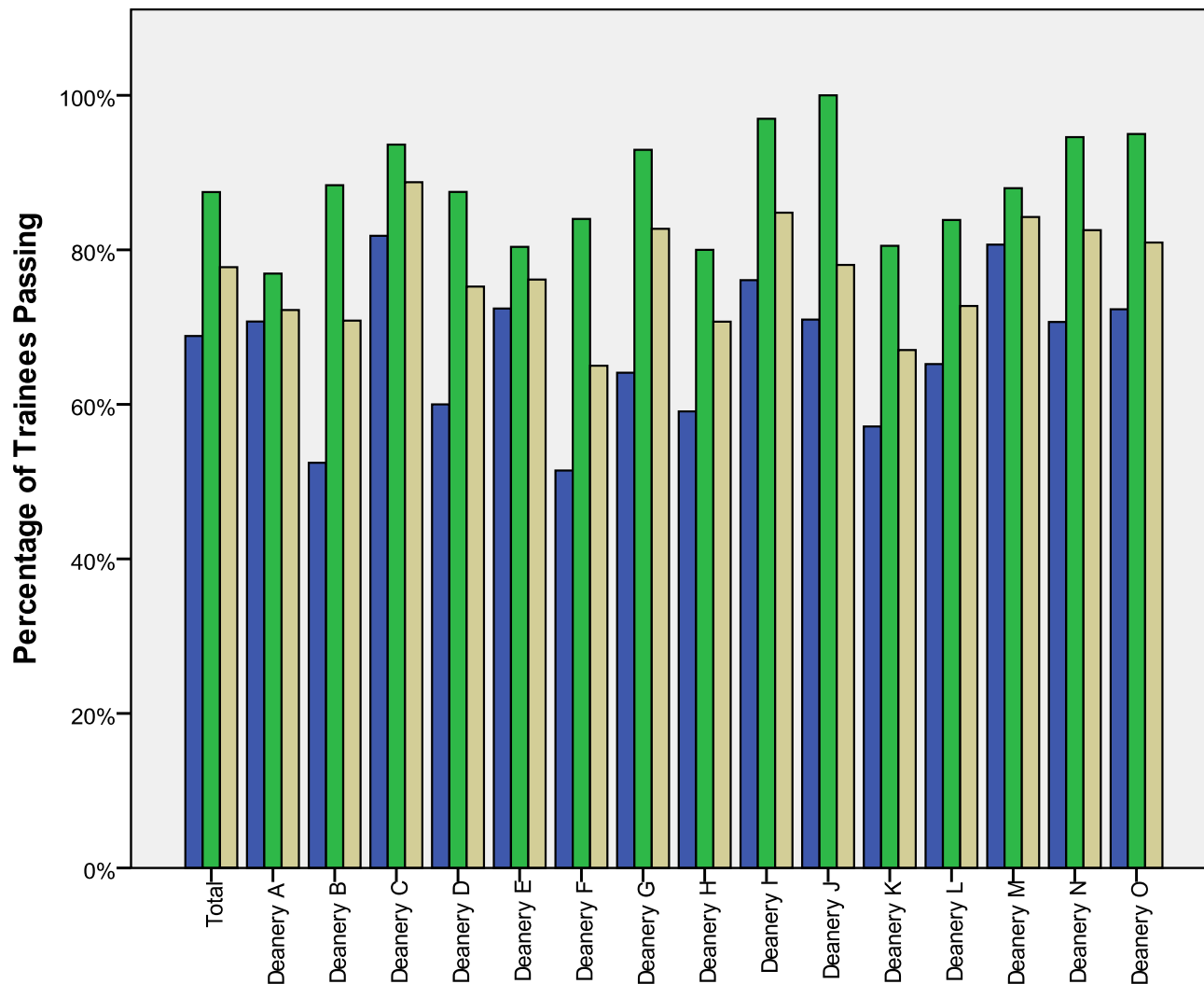

% trainees with Part 1 by 10.1

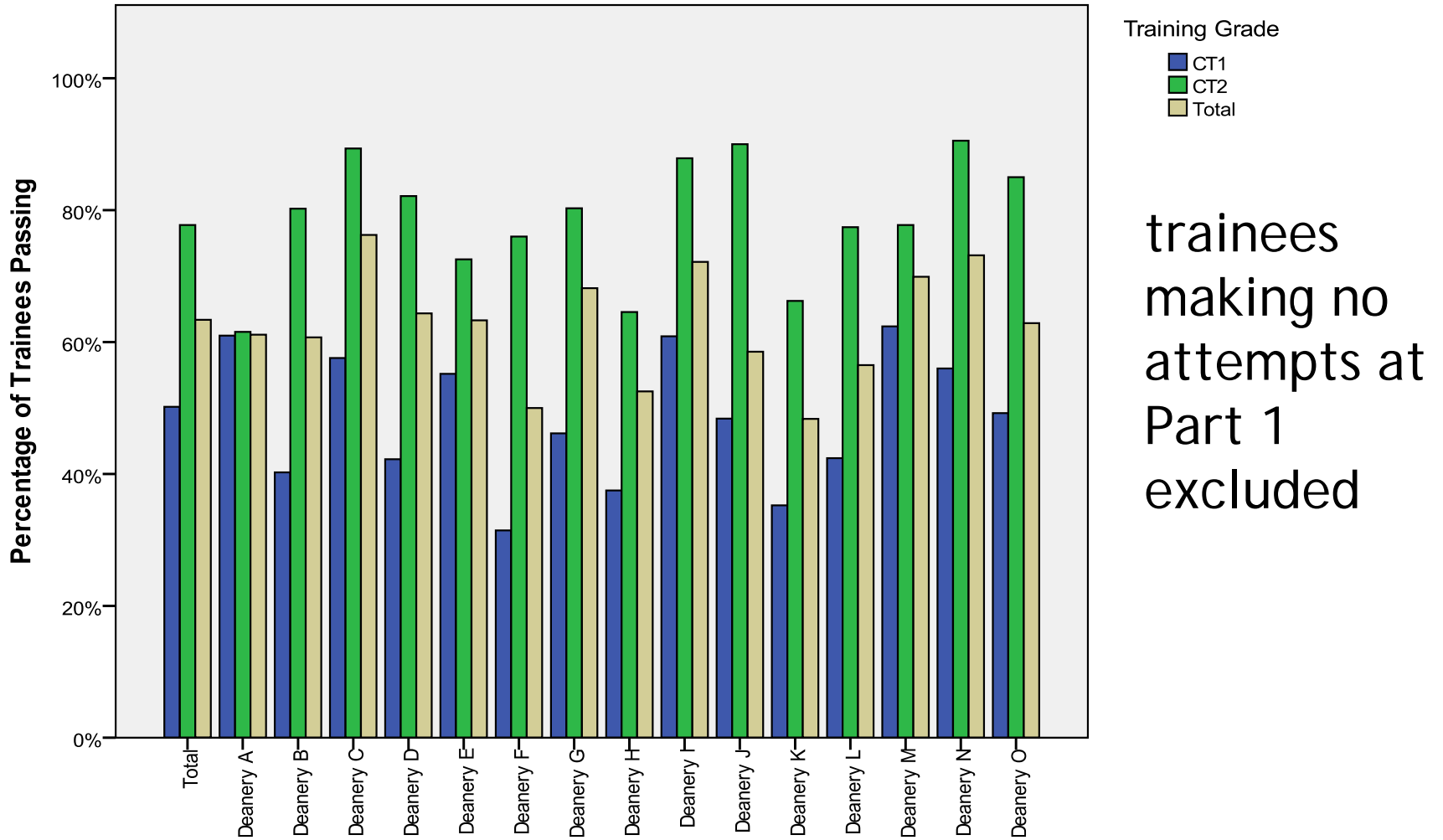

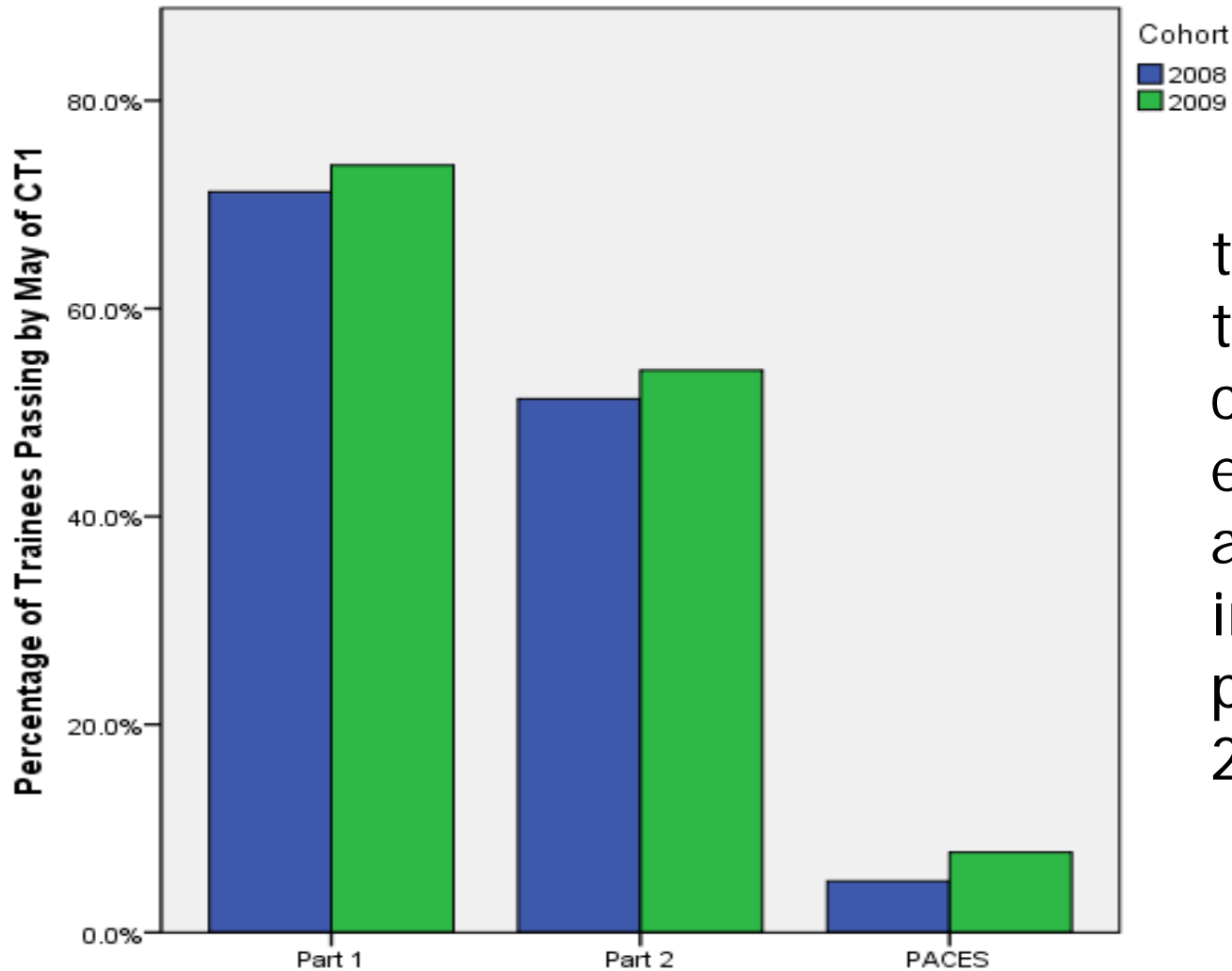

% trainees with Part 2 by 2010.1



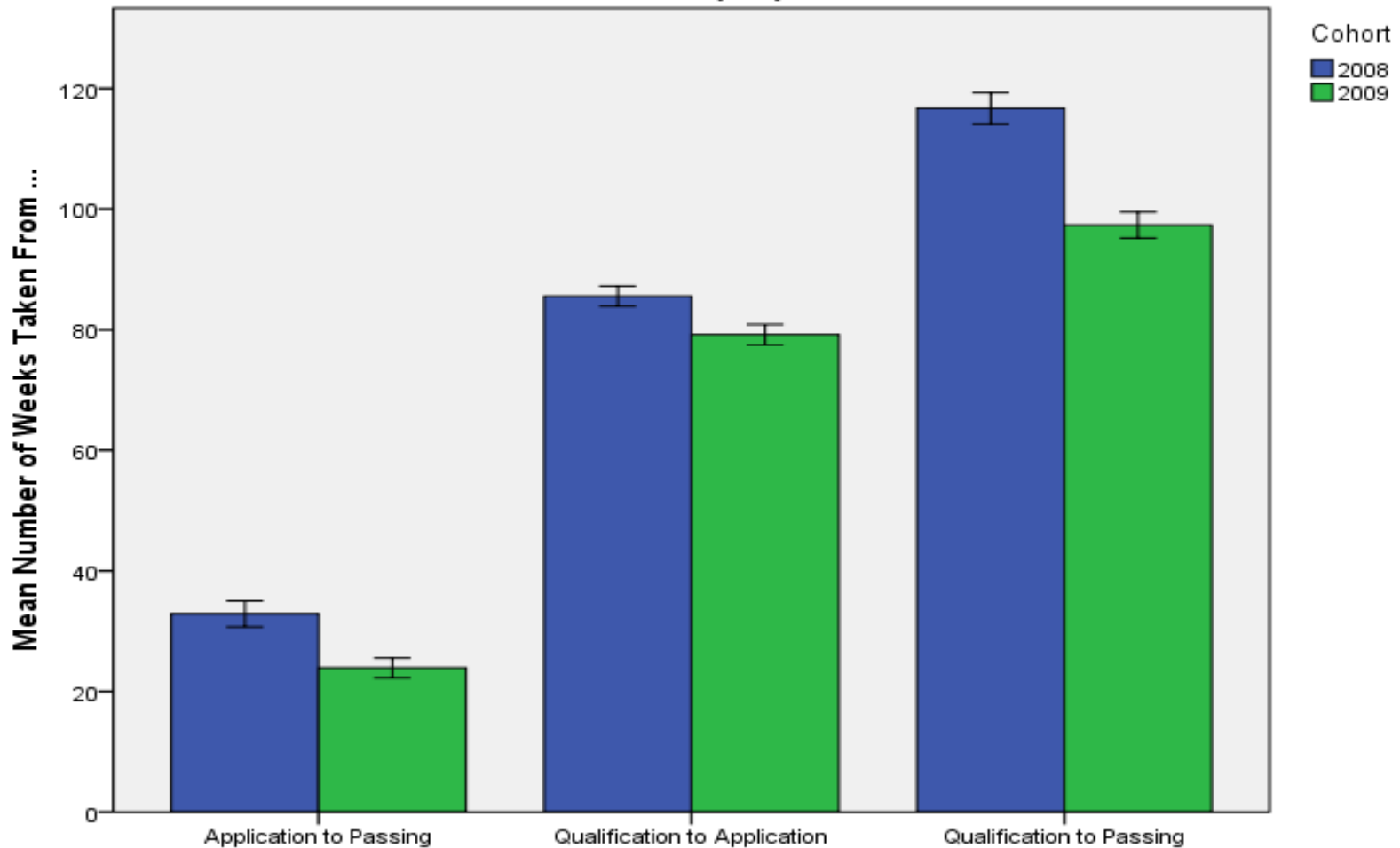
'09 trainees better pass rates?

MRCP(UK)

- 2nd diet results end of July
 - *could be offered an ST3 post conditional on passing?*
- Fail to pass?
 - *remedial training time possible:*
 - current CMT posts? but impacts on Foundation
 - conversion of vacant (acute) ST3 LAS / LAT posts
 - *opportunity to apply to ST3 in R2*
 - allows 2011.2 and possibly 2011.3 PACES results

Other Issues (1)

- PMETB merger with GMC
 - *implications*
- GIM transfer process
 - *those now in ST3+ appointed to old curricula wishing dual accreditation should transfer to GIM 2009 curriculum*
- Training fees
- GMC ruling on assessments
 - *taken out of training leads to CESR CP*

Other Issues (2)

- Number of trainees
 - *reduced CMT & ST3 in 2011*
 - *increased GP StRs*

- Cuts in MPET budget
 - *implications for training*
 - *especially remedial*
