Assessment, Consent, Communication <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Obtains informed consent using a structured approach <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Satisfactory procedural information - Risk & complications explained - Co-morbidity - Sedation - Opportunity for questions • Selects & prepares cases appropriate to the procedure • Demonstrates respect for patient's views and dignity during the procedure • Communicates clearly with patient, including outcome of procedure with appropriate management and f/u plan. Full endoscopy report. 		
Safety & sedation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Safe and secure IV access • Gives appropriate dose of analgesia and sedation and ensures adequate oxygenation and monitoring of patient • Demonstrates good communication with the nursing staff, including dosages & vital signs 		
Endoscopic Skills during insertion & procedure <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Checks endoscope function before intubation • Intubates the oesophagus safely • Intubates the duodenum under direct vision • Uses distension, suction & lens washing appropriately • Achieves a satisfactory position opposite the ampulla (or target) • Demonstrates awareness of patient's consciousness and comfort during the procedure and takes appropriate actions • Completes procedure in reasonable time 		
Diagnostic & Therapeutic Ability <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adequate ampullary visualisation • Catheterises the duct of interest • Accurate identification & appropriate management of pathology • Selects and correctly uses appropriate accessories • High quality images recorded • Applies therapeutic techniques appropriately and safely • Recognises & manages complications appropriately
