## Introduction

The Specialty Specific Questions have been developed to test trainee's access to, participation in or confidence in the attainment of specific aspects of the specialty training curriculum.

The questions have been included as Programme Specific Questions in the annual GMC National Trainee Survey. The details of these questions and the trainee responses (nationally, by Deanery/LETB and by grade can be found within this report.

345 Endocrinology and Diabetes trainees (73 ST3, 69 ST4, 71 ST5, 66 ST6 and 66 ST7 trainees) an overall decrease of 1% compared to 2016, completed the 2017 survey. The numbers of trainees in each Deanery / LETB completing the survey were as follows:

#### **Specialty Specific Questions – Endocrinology and Diabetes Mellitus**

There were significant regional differences in trainee responses for many of the 5 Endocrinology and Diabetes Mellitus specialty specific questions asked in 2017. 


